About the Position

This exempt recruitment is being opened to fill one vacancy in the Public Defender's Office. The Chief Deputy Public Defender position is exempt from the San Joaquin County Civil Service system. Appointments to exempt positions in San Joaquin County are at-will and are not governed by Civil Service Rules. This recruitment is limited to those who currently work in the San Joaquin County Public Defender's Office. A background investigation will be required for all final candidates. Final appointment will be conditional upon passing state Department of Justice Live Scan fingerprinting.

About the Department

The Public Defender provides constitutionally mandated indigent defense services in all criminal matters as is required by the U.S. Constitution.

The San Joaquin County Public Defender's Office is dedicated to serving the diverse needs of our community and its justice system by furnishing clients whose cases have been entrusted to the office, with competent, effective, loyal, ethical, zealous, compassionate and efficient advocacy.

The Public Defender's primary practice areas are:

- Adult Criminal Defense
- Juvenile Criminal Defense
- Child Dependency (focus on parents)
- Mental Commitment Defense
 Civil Extension Actions (§ 1026.5, W&I, § 1800 et. seq.)

The San Joaquin County Public Defender was established as a County Department in 1968. The office is a major public law office, serving the county's 30 judicial positions in 5 locations, with 53 attorneys, 13 investigators and an administrative support staff of 19. Public Defender attorneys and staff handle an incoming caseload exceeding 1800 cases per month.

- Plans, organizes and supervises the work of supervises the work of subordinate attorneys in defending individuals accused of various criminal and/or other matters before a court of law; assigns cases; trains and advises subordinates regarding the effective and appropriate defense of clients; evaluates subordinate work performance.
- Supervises and participates in, both directly and indirectly, the defense of clients in criminal or other matters, particularly when very serious and/or complex issues are involved; examines and cross-examines witnesses, presents arguments, and prepares/reviews briefs, memoranda, opinions, and civil/criminal pleadings; confers with prosecution attorneys, probation authorities, court officials and others to discuss pleas, modification of charges, presentation and review of evidence, and other legal matters; participates in mediation hearings.
- Researches, analyzes and interprets existing laws and ordinances, court decisions, pending legislation and other legal authorities; assists in drafting legislation for special County and State projects.
- Recommends administrative policy and procedural changes to improve staff effectiveness; participates in administrative projects and assignments; prepares correspondence and reports.
- Confers with prosecutors, court officers, probation and others to discuss matters of policy on behalf of the Public Defender's Office, including advisory
